“ We were both in our twenties when I met Chris. Me late and her early. I honestly cannot remember which mutual friend introduced us, but in time we ended up having many mutual friends, some we did not know we had already. The friend that introduced us was either Laura Cuffe or David Nathan. Then again David and I may have met her at the same time because we spent a lot of time together back then. The four of us, Chris, Laura, David, and I went to quite a few concerts together both locally and down in LA throughout the 1990s. I need to find some black and white photos of Christine and Andrea Judd. The pictures are from outside the Bakersfield Civic Auditorium when we were visiting before the show started. I am fairly sure it was *Suicidal Tendencies* because I had my camera with me, and I shot pictures of that show. Sorry but it was before digital, so I need to scan it to show it. They were both young and beautiful and dressed like sexy rocker chicks for the show. Chris never lost her beauty inside or out.



I had an internship with the Bakersfield Californian newspaper as a photojournalist in 1993. Joseph Danks, a man who was already in prison for murder. Either the authorities or news outlets had dubbed him the Koreatown Slasher. He was a bizarre man. He had killed his cell mate and was on trial for this new crime. Christine was fascinated for reasons of her own with the trial and the convict. She began going to most of the hearings. Covering the case was Steve Swenson, a veteran reporter with the Bakersfield Californian and a friend. Steve noticed her in the gallery at many of the hearings and started talking with Chris. He was curious as to why she was there so often and began getting to know her. He became fascinated with her interest in the case. Steve considered doing a story on her, but she declined, she was not interested in drawing attention to herself. Steve and Chris still became friends, and he would talk with her outside the courtroom. When he interviewed Danks he asked him a few questions for Chris. One question was if she could exchange letters with him. She and Danks began writing, I do not know how many letters were exchanged between them. She showed me one

of the letters he wrote to her, and it looked like the letter of a mad man. If you look him up it was April 1993 when Danks was on trial for the murder of the cellmate. When Steve found out Chris and I were friends he started telling me about his newfound friendship with her. He was excited to have her as a shared friend. After that, every time he seen her Steve would tell me about it and how lovely and interesting a person she was. And she was both.

I loved talking with her about everything, our hopes, our dreams, our crushes or what our favorite musician were doing and where they may be next. (Mostly we liked the same music but her and David were Slayer fans, me not so much). She had huge crushes on a few rock stars, but Dave Navarro was the one she always talked about the most and I am sure she was still crushing on him up until the day she passed. She was so much fun. She had an enthusiastic sense of humor, and I do not recall seeing an unhappy Chris that often. I am sure she had those times of sadness. I know her life was not always great. She lost her mother when she was young and lived with her grandmother and an aunt. I did not know her during the 1970s but during that time she lived in a capital A shaped house right down the street from me.

David Nathan, Christine, and I also took day trips down to LA to hang out, do, and see stuff. On one trip when we were on our way back to Bakersfield, we stopped at a car dealership in Valencia. Chris knew she could get the best quote from a larger market area than Bakersfield. She had already done the research and knew exactly what she was after. I cannot remember what model car it was, but the maker was Toyota if I am remembering it correctly. It has been a minute. I may have gotten this wrong. Chris really liked
