“ John was my 2nd piping instructor. Starting in the fall of 1998, I drove from my home in Los Osos to Santa Maria every Wednesday for (3) years to learn light and great music from him.

We traveled to many highland games together,. shared motel rooms, and gave it our best... I took him fishing around Morro Bay a couple of times.. We almost fell out of the boat when he nabbed a ling cod and we BOTH rushed to the stern to bring it in...!

Later, he judged me at comps at the Monterey Games (where I tuned on the platform to his great slow aire "Lochan Ora," and later at the Pleasanton Games where I crashed and burned bc I was way outta tune.

He helped me greatly on some of my own compositions, adding flavor to some of my stale jigs.

One of my fondest memories was the time where I took a prize (2nd?) at the Queen Mary Games where he was tuning me up as a nervous Grade 4 piper and he said my pipes were "ringing like a bell" and to go out there before the judge and "play well."

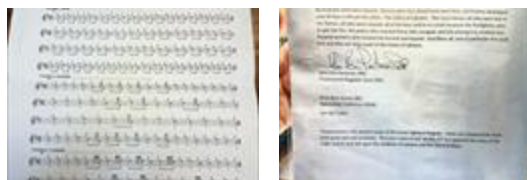

“ *In remembrance of my brother, John Eric Partanen, during happier times we shared growing up....*

My earliest memories are on the freighter ship we took from Seattle to Chile, South America when we were barely past being toddlers, along with the times and adventures we had living in one of the driest places on earth while Dad worked for Anaconda Copper. Then, the flights over the Andes to Syracuse, New York where we lived with Aunt Beth in that enormous white farmhouse out in the country. We feasted on fresh berries and veggies – and hunted owls in the barn. Our younger brother Robert was born during this time.

When Dad came home from Chile, he reenlisted in the Airforce and we moved to Washington, D.C, then Virginia and then Maryland. There were many weekends spent at the Smithsonian and other memorials and historical sites, where our minds were stuffed with the amazing history of our great country. There are many memories with John and little Robert at beaches on the Eastern shoreline, weekend camping trips, fishing and hunting for crawdads.

Then to fast forward – we lived in Missouri for a bit and eventually Southern California where we subsequently moved to La Habra, California, which would be pivotal in my brother’s life. The school we attended was known as La Habra High School, and their mascot was the La Habra Highlanders. It was there that my brother found a passion for and took up the Scottish bagpipes. He went on to become a performer, band leader, teacher and mentor of the pipes. Our family loved his special concerts whenever he would visit.

We did have many happy times – too many to share here. Memories of my brother John will forever be entwined in my heart when I hear the great Scottish pipes.

Rest in peace in the arms of our Lord and Savior brother John.
